Welcome to the Village of Coxsackie!

We hope you enjoy your time here in the Hudson Valley, but there are a few local rules that we want to make you aware of...

We are a small village, and our speed limits are strictly enforced. Please help us keep the community safe. Drive carefully!

Please be aware of noise restrictions within the village. Music, television, etc. should be enjoyed at a reasonable volume. The following acts are prohibited and declared to be a violation: The playing of music or sound-producing device or the operation of any radio, television receiver or phonograph, the playing of music by any band or orchestra in such a manner and with such volume between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., except on such special occasion upon consent and permission of the Village Board. These hours differ slightly from the general prohibition noise restrictions which run from 8:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.

When enjoying our local parks please remember to dispose of all trash properly, including pet waste! Trash cans are provided in all Village of Coxsackie parks. Only authorized Village vehicles are allowed to drive into McQuade Park and no alcohol is permitted. However, you can enjoy a delicious alcoholic drink at various establishments in downtown Coxsackie, or in West Coxsackie.

For household trash, please do not use public trash cans or the trash cans of other residents. Your rental host should provide trash removal and cans should not be left on the street/sidewalk past 8:00 p.m. on the scheduled trash collection day.

Please obey all parking regulations, including those for snow emergencies in winter. There is no parking permitted in our alleyways.

The Village of Coxsackie is a dog friendly community. However, dogs must be leashed at all times in all public areas (including parks, playgrounds, streets, and sidewalks). Please, pick up after your pet, and help keep Coxsackie beautiful.
